**Level 3 Predatory Offender Notification**

On 03/28/20, Joshua Matthew McMillen will be moving into a residence located in the 30000 block of State Hwy 6 in Perry Lake Township in rural Crosby, MN. He has resided in the City of Brainerd previous to moving to this area and the Sheriff's Office wants the public to be made aware that he is relocating to a rural Crosby address.

McMillen engaged in sexual contact with a known teenage female. He was released on 11/05/2019 and is on supervised probation. Sheriff Goddard wants to keep the public informed as to the known locations of predatory offenders but also reminds the public that he cannot control where they choose to reside. There will not be a public hearing held due to current guidelines regarding social distancing and attendance in groups. "My highest priority is public safety and I want you to know that all predatory offenders in Crow Wing County are closely monitored by my office for compliance. As always, we ask that the public report any suspicious activity immediately so we can investigate. This notification is designed to make our citizens aware of the general location of Joshua McMillen's whereabouts."

#### **RISK LEVEL THREE**





The *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* is releasing this information pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 244.052 and 253D. This statute authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform communities of a public registrant's release from prison or a secure treatment facility when the *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* believes that the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of Criminal Sexual Conduct or another offense that requires registration with law enforcement pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 243.166 or 243.167.

This individual *has served the sentence* imposed on them by the court and is transitioning into the community. This notification is not intended to increase fear but rather raise awareness. Law enforcement believes that an informed public is a safer public.

The *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* may not direct where this individual does or does not reside, nor can this agency direct where they work or go to school.

Convicted sexual and predatory individuals have always been released to live in our communities. It was not until the passage of the Registration Act that law enforcement had an ability to track movement of these individuals after their initial release. With the passage of the Community Notification Act law enforcement may now share information about many of these individuals with the public. Abuse of this information to threaten, harass or intimidate a registered person is unacceptable and such acts could be charged as a crime. Such abuses could potentially end the ability of law enforcement to provide these notifications
