Sheriff Goddard is holding a virtual public meeting on Tuesday, January 19th, 2021 at 6:00 pm. The meeting is designed to inform the public about a level 3 predatory offender who is moving into Crow Wing County on January 20th, 2021.

The offender, Lumasakila Izick Patterson, 07/16/91, will be residing on Johnson Road in First Assessment where he will be monitored by staff 24 hours a day. Patterson was released from prison in 2017 and has been on intensive supervised release (ISR) since that time.

The public is invited to the meeting to listen to Sheriff Goddard, his staff, representatives from the Minnesota Department of Corrections, and staff from the home Patterson will reside. There will also be an opportunity for questions from the community. Sheriff Goddard reminds residents that his office diligently monitors all registered offenders in the County. As always, Sheriff Goddard requests that citizens report any suspicious activity to law enforcement. Patterson will continue to be monitored by ISR personnel and the sheriff's office.

NOTIFICATION OF RELEASE IN MINNESOTA

RISK LEVEL THREE

In addition to level two notification (schools and daycares as well as establishments and organizations that primarily serve individuals likely to be victimized by the registrant), law enforcement may notify other members of the community whom the registrant is likely to encounter.

The *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* is releasing this information pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 244.052 and 253D. This statute authorizes law enforcement agencies to inform communities of a public registrant's release from prison or a secure treatment facility when the *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* believes that the release of information will enhance public safety and protection.

The individual who appears on this notification has been convicted of Criminal Sexual Conduct or another offense that requires registration with law enforcement pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 243.166 or 243.167.

This individual *has served the sentence* imposed on them by the court and is transitioning into the community. This notification is not intended to increase fear but rather raise awareness. Law enforcement believes that an informed public is a safer public.

The *Crow Wing County Sheriff's Office* may not direct where this individual does or does not reside, nor can this agency direct where they work or go to school.

Convicted sexual and predatory individuals have always been released to live in our communities. It was not until the passage of the Registration Act that law enforcement had an ability to track movement of these individuals after their initial release. With the passage of the Community Notification Act law enforcement may now share information about many of these individuals with the public. Abuse of this information to threaten, harass or intimidate a registered person is unacceptable and such acts could be charged as a crime. Such abuses could potentially end the ability of law enforcement to provide these notifications.
