**Minnesota State Law**

Requires all used oil to be stored in leak proof containers.  
Drain all oil filters prior to disposal.  
Disposing used oil and filters on the ground or in the  
garbage is illegal.

## What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)?

Household hazardous wastes are products that can be an environmental or health hazard when stored or disposed of improperly. A product or substance is hazardous when it contains one or more of the following properties:

### **Corrosive/Caustic**

Example: Drain Cleaner

### **Reactive**

Example: Ether

### **Flammable**

Example: Gasoline

### **Toxic/Poisonous**

Example: Pesticides



Read all product labels to identify potentially harmful sub-stances. Check for signal words such as **Caution**, **Warning**, or **Danger**. These words may indicate a product is a household hazardous waste.

The Crow Wing County Household Waste Facility will accept HHW items at no charge from county residents.

### **Avoid buying aerosols.**



## Household Hazardous Waste Acceptable Products

Contents of all containers must be identifiable.  
Unknown products will not be accepted.

Business, Commercial, and Farm Waste will not be accepted at the Household Hazardous Waste Facility.

## PRODUCT EXCHANGE

The Crow Wing County Household Hazardous Waste Facility's Product Exchange is available at no cost for county residents 18 years or older during designated HHW hours or call for an appointment.

If you have a product that is usable and stored in the original container and is in good condition you may bring it to the HHW Facility where it will be accepted at no charge.

### Save Big Dollars

If you need a product or looking for that special item, then check our Household Hazardous Waste Facility's Product Exchange before buying new.

### IT'S FREE

You can use as much as you need, and can return what you don't use!

If you must buy a product containing hazardous material, buy only what you need and use it up.  
If you can't use it all up, give it to a friend or donate the leftovers.

### Before you buy, ask yourself:

- Do I really need this product?
- Did I check for signal words?
- Is there a safer alternative?
- Am I buying more than I need?
- Can I safely store this product in my home?
- What is the best way to dispose of the product after I buy it?
- Can I buy it in a non-aerosol container?
